

Depending on the program, students may complete up to two years worth of university level coursework at Camosun. Students are to confirm with their destination institution that the below academic requirements & non-academic preparations are current. Students should also confirm deadlines and GPA requirements for admission with their destination institution. Because admission to these programs is competitive, students should have a backup plan that may include an alternative degree.

UBC's Faculty of Medicine, in collaboration with the University of Northern British Columbia (UNBC), the University of Victoria (UVic), and the provincial government launched a distributed medical education program. Medical training in BC is now distributed across three sites: the Island Medical Program (IMP) at UVic, the Northern Medical Program (NMP) at UNBC, and the Vancouver-Fraser Medical Program (VFMP) at UBC.

Academic Requirements

- 3 years (90 credits) of courses towards a degree at a recognized university
- There are no specific degrees required for admission to Medicine
- Check directly with this institution for required or recommended course work

Non-Academic Preparation

- The Medical College Admission Test (MCAT)
- Activities and interests which demonstrate leadership, cooperation, service ethics, motivation, social concern, responsibility, creativity, scientific and intellectual curiosity, attitude toward continuing learning, maturity, integrity, and realistic self appraisal
- Intentional community involvement in paid or volunteer positions is valued and can encompass a variety of experiences within and outside the health care setting.
