So you want to study PHYSICAL or OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Depending on the program, students may complete up to two years worth of university level coursework at Camosun. Students are to confirm with their destination institution that the below academic requirements & non-academic preparations are current. Students should also confirm deadlines and GPA requirements for admission with their destination institution. Because admission to these programs is competitive, students should have a backup plan that may include an alternative degree.

Academic Requirements

- An undergraduate degree from UBC **or** a recognized university
- University level course work in Human Anatomy, Social Sciences, Behavioral Sciences
- Check directly with this institution for required or recommended course work

Non-Academic Preparation

- A minimum of 70 hours of volunteer or paid work which includes direct contact involving interaction with persons with cognitive, emotional, or physical disabilities at no more than two facilities.

Academic Requirements

- Preference is given to residents of British Columbia. A BC Resident is defined as a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant who has lived in BC for 12 consecutive months prior to the starting month of the program, or who has a permanent address in BC.
