NOTES:

1. You may use ENGL 150 in lieu of ENGL 151 toward program completion.
2. Math 108 is a prerequisite for Econ 203 and 204. The prerequisite for Math 108 is Math 12 with a C+. If you have not taken Math 12, you will have to complete a pre-calculus course as a prerequisite for Math 108 – one of Math 107, or 105 or 115. You may take Math 100 (Requires B in Math) instead of Math 108. It is recommended that you plan on taking Math 108 early on to ensure timely program completion.
3. You may take Math 216, or 116, or 218 instead of Bus 230 to complete the Associate of Arts Degree in Economics. UVic Econ 245 and 246 may be substituted for Bus 230 and 231.
4. You may use Engl 160 or 163 in lieu of Engl 161 toward program completion.
5. Arts courses – choose from the list of Humanities courses (above) or Social Science courses (ANTH, ASIA, CRIM, ECON, GEOG, GSWS, PSC, PSYC, SOC, SOCW 211, 212)
6. This course must be from an area other than Economics.

How does the Associate Degree transfer to universities?

All courses must be university transfer courses. It is recommended that students check the BC Transfer Guide <http://bctransferguide.ca> prior to registering in a course to ensure that all courses transfer to the desired receiving university. Students must choose elective courses to satisfy the program requirements of the receiving university. Please refer to 2013/14 academic calendars of UVic, UBC and SFU for specific requirements:

Applicants who have been granted an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree from a recognized BC post-secondary institution will be granted 30 units of transfer credit if admitted to a degree program. Note that students receiving 30 units of transfer credit for completion of the associate degree are still obliged to fulfill all prerequisites in the degree program to which they are admitted.

Students with Associate Degrees of Arts or Science from a recognized college or university college in BC or the Yukon, if admitted to the Faculty of Arts or the Faculty of Science, are guaranteed full transfer credit (60 credits) for the work done for their Associate Degree. Students must still meet all 100- and 200-level course requirements for specific degree programs (e.g., majors, honours, faculty-level requirements), which may require students to take more than 120 total credits to earn their degree. Students admitted with Associate Degrees must meet the competitive admission average for the program to which they apply if this average is above the published minimum.

Graduates holding associate of arts or associate of science degrees from BC colleges recognized by the BC Ministry of Advanced Education will receive preference in the admission process as follows.

- The minimum average for associate degree students will be established each term at a level 0.25 GPA points less than that required for regular transfer students, but shall not be less than 2.00.
- Transfer credit will be given for all individually transferable courses. When the individually assigned credit from all sources totals less than 60 units, additional general elective credit will be assigned to bring the transfer credit total to 60 units.
