

Business Administration Accounting Diploma

Admission to the Accounting diploma

English 12, minimum "C+" grade.

Note: Acct 110, Econ 103, Econ 104, Fin 110, and Mark 110 require Math 11 as a prerequisite. Students may enter the diploma program without Math but must complete the Math requirement in or before their first semester of study, and before they will be eligible to complete courses that require the Math prerequisite.

Diploma Program Content & Requirements

The accounting diploma program consists of 20 courses, 19 mandatory courses and one elective course.

A co-op designation, which is optional, requires two co-op work terms.

Diploma Elective Course Guidelines

The diploma elective may be any level but if it is a 100 level course, it must be a non-business university transfer course.

If the elective is a two hundred or higher level course it may be a School of Business course or a university transfer course.

Admission to the BBA requires the completion of 20 program courses with a B- average (70%, 4.0/9.0). The 20 courses required for admission must include

- Accounting: ACCT 110, 111, 210, 211 and 220
- Business: BUS 150, 141 and 276
- Economics: ECON 103
- English: *One of* ENGL 151, 161, 163 or ENGL 164
- Finance: FIN 110 and FIN 210
- Math: *One of* BUS 231, MATH 100, 105, 107, 108, 109, 112, 113, 115, or MATH 126

CPA Professional Education Program (CPA PEP)

The BBA (Accounting Major) credential is officially recognized by CPA Canada. Graduates can apply directly to CPA PEP upon completion of the BBA, as the BBA includes all of the necessary prerequisites for the CPA PEP program.
