

# **NEGITEL** (Ne Kwee Tul). Paying attention to each other

## Terms of Reference – June 7, 2021

## **Description**

NECITEL is a SENĆOŦEN word that references 'paying attention to one another'. Sandee Mitchell connected with Al Sam who provided us with permission to use the word and shared the pronunciation (Ne Kwee Tul).

We use the term NECITEL to describe the guiding partnership between:

- Eyē? Sqâ'lewen: the Centre for Indigenous Education & Community Connections (IECC)
- The Camosun College Foundation, and
- Camosun Innovates

This partnership helps prepare Camosun to lead, support, or engage in research involving Indigenous people, communities, and knowledge application.

The existence of an Indigenous research space at Camosun is an opportunity to attract interest from Indigenous communities, agencies, and scholars, to partner in research projects that result in reciprocal benefit. It provides a venue for the endorsement of accountable, respectful, and well-designed research projects that draw from and positively impact Indigenous communities, peoples, and knowledge. It also inspires potential funders, partners, and supporters to imagine projects they might not otherwise consider, fostering confidence in Indigenous research enterprises.

## **Mandate**

NECITEL is concerned with sharing and synthesizing knowledge to support Indigenous people and communities in reaching their self-identified social, educational, economic and cultural goals.

#### **Philosophy**

Indigenous people know what they need.

Indigenous traditional knowledge is the intellectual property of the communities, families, and/or individuals who are its keepers. NE&ITEL is committed to the preservation and protection of Indigenous knowledge.

The intersectionality of Indigenous culture, knowledge, and values cannot be separated from traditional lands, historical experiences, and persistent inequities.

Camosun College co-imagines and co-creates shared projects with Indigenous people and communities while respectfully preserving and protecting Indigenous autonomy and traditional knowledge.

#### **Protocols**

NECITEL invites Indigenous people and communities to identify research and development needs they may wish to pursue in partnership with Camosun College.

NECITEL shares information about and inquiries from Indigenous people and communities in order to support Indigenous interests, facilitate communication, and expand the potential for engagement.

NECITEL invites Indigenous research projects from Camosun College students, staff and faculty that align with the philosophy and mandate of the guiding partnership.

NECITEL gathers and shares information about potential project collaborators, funders, partners, and supporters.

NECITEL supports <u>Chapter 9 of the Tri-Council Policy</u>, Indigenous research ethics, and review by the college <u>Research Ethics Board</u> to support the protection of Indigenous traditional knowledge.

NECITEL collaborates and/or keeps each other informed about the progress of projects.

#### **Procedures**

NECITEL collaborates, as appropriate, on proposal development in preparation for the conduct of responsible research activity, as well as the research itself.

NECITEL provides encouragement for dedicated research projects but does not engage formally in the supervision of research personnel.

NECITEL does not occupy a single dedicated space on Camosun campuses, serving a support function and focusing its operations and processes on virtual spaces and communications.

NECITEL strives to remain informed about all Indigenous research projects undertaken by Camosun personnel.

NECITEL supports the sharing of information and knowledge associated with Indigenous research conducted within the scope of the guiding partnership.

NECITEL will meet a minimum of once per semester.
