SOCIAL CONNECTIONS

Encouraging student interaction in learning activities helps students build relational and networking skills which are valuable in maintaining well-being.

Suggestions:

- 1. Have students get to know each other early in the course, using introduction exercises and emphasizing the importance of personal connection.
- 2. Provide information on group process function to guide students in anticipating and navigating projects requiring group work.
- 3. Encourage students to participate in study groups.
- 4. Include marks for positive group process in the grading of group assignments.
- 5. When possible, organize your classroom with tables and chairs that can be pulled into "pods" to facilitate small-group discussion.
- 6. Design lecture assignments that require students to work collectively on study questions.
- 7. Encouraged students to form "buddy teams", to study and also to share lecture notes, should one partner miss a lecture.
- 8. Have activities like mini- breaks, where students are encouraged to find out certain things about each other on a personal level.
- 9. Encourage peer review and peer evaluation, using a review template or rubric.
