


#### COVID-19

## What does an HCA do?

- HCAs are front-line care-givers
- Work in home support, adult day care, group homes, assisted living, complex care, and acute care
- Under the direction and supervision of a health professional, HCAs provide care aimed at promoting and maintaining the physical, psychological and social well-being of clients across the life-span with the focus being on the older adult
- If unionized, starting wage is approximately \$23 \$24/hr.
- Non-unionized is approximately \$16 \$22/hr.



## HCA Program Intakes

- Full-time programs: January, May & September intakes (29 weeks / 7 months) Monday to Friday daytime
- Full-time English as a Second Language (ESL): Starts in mid
  October (11 months) Monday to Friday daytime
- Full-time Indigenous program (11 months): September



## **HCA Program Clinical Experiences**

- HCA clinical experiences include a variety of sites. The location of these sites vary, but are all located in the South Island area
- There are three clinical experiences. The first one is 2 weeks in complex care. The second clinical experience is 6 weeks in complex care. The third clinical experience is 2 weeks in community.
- Start times for clinicals vary. For the first and second, start time is 0645, ending at 1300 to 1330
- The hours for the third clinical can vary days / evenings







## South Island Partnership

- Dual credit programs for high school students (dogwood & HCA certificate). Apply <a href="here">here</a>
- Open to grade 11 & 12 students
- Provides up to 32 high school credits
- Tuition is covered by the school district
- Students pay for books & personal equipment
- Prerequisites: 60% in English 11 or assessment

### **HCA Admission Requirements**

- Attend an Information Session complete the survey to confirm attendance
- **Self-declaration form** confirming level of English proficiency. See Camosun website: <a href="https://webservices.camosun.ca/events/hca-english-competency">https://webservices.camosun.ca/events/hca-english-competency</a>
- Proof of HCA Program English Language Competency Requirement:
  - There are two options for meeting the English Language Competency Requirements (as set out by the BC Care Aide Registry), depending on whether your previous education:
    - 1. English Educated: Applicants educated in an English-speaking environment/country with English language systems/institutions for a minimum of seven years or for four consecutive years at the secondary or post-secondary level (C or higher in English 11).
    - 2. Non-English Educated: Applicants not educated in an English-speaking environment/a country with English language systems/institutions (See website for details on accepted tests).

## **HCA Application Process**

- Submit an application in person or <u>on-line</u> and pay \$42.66.
- All prerequisites need to be submitted.
- Applications are date stamped.
- The first 32 fully qualified applicants (numbers depend on the program) are offered a seat. A \$175.00 non-refundable deposit is required when offered a seat. This money will then go towards your first semester tuition.
- If for any reason you change your mind after you have accepted a seat, PLEASE phone Registration at 250-370-3550 and let them know immediately. There are always students waiting for a seat that would appreciate advance notice that they have a seat in the program.



### **Program Participation Requirements**

- TB skin test
- Current immunizations
- Criminal Records Check
- Food safe
- Standard First Aid with CPR Level "C"

Please note these are program requirements and should not be done before you have an accepted seat.

- Have good physical health (you need to have good mobility, stamina and skin integrity).


#### Why Choose Camosun?























