

We are delighted that you are considering the Health Care Assistant program as your area of study and will take great pleasure in getting to know you, while we work and learn together. We hope you enjoy your experience with us, and wish you success in all that you do!

What does an HCA do?

HCAs are front-line care-givers

- Work in home support, adult day care, group homes, assisted living, complex care, and acute care
- Under the direction and supervision of a health professional, HCAs provide care aimed at promoting and maintaining the physical, psychological and social well-being of clients across the life-span with the focus being on the older adult
- If unionized, starting wage is approximately \$29 \$30/hr.
 - Non-unionized is approximately \$23 \$29/hr.



HCA Program Intakes

Full-time programs:

- January, May & September intakes
 - (29 weeks / 7 months) Monday to Friday daytime

Full-time English as a Second Language (ESL):

- Starts in October
 - (11 months) Monday to Friday daytime

Full-time Indigenous program:

- September
- (10 months)





HCA Admission Requirements

- Attend an Information Session complete the survey to confirm attendance
- Self-declaration form confirming level of English proficiency.

HCA Admission Requirements

Proof of HCA Program **English Language Competency** Requirement:

- There are two options for meeting the English Language Competency Requirements (as set out by the BC Care Aide Registry), depending on whether your previous education:
 - 1. English Educated: Applicants educated in an English-speaking environment/country with English language systems/institutions for a minimum of seven years or for four consecutive years at the secondary or post-secondary level (C or higher in English 11).
- 2. Non-English Educated: Applicants not educated in an English-speaking environment/a country with English language systems/institutions (See website CAMOSUN for details on accepted tests).

HCA Application Process

Submit an application online and pay \$47.10

- All prerequisites need to be submitted.
- Applications are date stamped.

The first 24 fully qualified applicants (numbers depend on the program) are offered a seat.

\$175.00 non-refundable deposit is required when offered a seat. It will then go towards your first semester tuition.

If for any reason you change your mind after you have accepted a seat, phone Registration at 250-370-3550 and let them know immediately. There students waiting for a seat that would appreciate advance notice that they have a seat in the program.

Program Participation Requirements

Once accepted into the program, students will be required to complete the following:

- TB skin test
- Current immunizations
- Criminal Records Check
- Food safe
- Basic Life Support
- COVID-19 double vaccination or one dose of Jansen COVID 19
- The Health Care Assistant Practice in BC E-Learning Modules (LearningHub)
- The Recognizing and Responding to Adult Abuse course (LearningHub)
- The Student Practice Education Core Orientation (SPECO) (LearningHub)

Please note these are program requirements and should **NOT** be done before you have an accepted seat.

What Helps Students Be Successful?

- Support from family and friends.
- Devote approximately 15 to 30 hours each week to study, laboratory practice and assignments.
- Attend classes regularly.
- Achieve a balance between home and school life.

- Have daycare and alternatives set up for children (remember practicum shifts can start early or end late and may also require travel).
- Have good physical health (you need to have good mobility, stamina and skin integrity).


















HSHS Indigenous Student Support

Artemis is an instructor with Community, Family and Child Studies and can assist Indigenous students with education challenges and navigating supports at the college between September and April.


