





#### How to Apply

- Check to ensure all prerequisite courses meet entrance requirements with a minimum C+ grade
- Several of the required courses for admission can be taken online, such as first-year English and sometimes Psychology courses, and an elective.
- If you are a Camosun student, apply in the final year of your prerequisite courses
- If transferring, apply after you complete your prerequisite courses



#### **New Application Process Information**

- Applications accepted between Sept 15<sup>th</sup> and May 15<sup>th</sup>
  - Please note the class for 2024 is currently full
- After that date Camosun will begin to admit students in the order that they were fully qualified from the students that applied during that 8 month period
- 24 seats are offered each year
  - 2 designated seats are available for an Indigenous student
  - Up to 4 additional designated International seats may be offered
- This program has a high demand, so apply early to increase chances of admission. Once the class for September is full, the waitlist is dissolved and a new waitlist will begin for the subsequent year
  - If you are not selected for admission, you will need to re-apply the following year

### Things You Should Know If Accepted

- If accepted, registration will advise you of deposit requirements and key college dates
- The program has additional documentation required on or before the first day of classes, including but not-limited to:
  - Follow the process provided by the college to complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC)
  - Complete CPR Basic Life Support Course that will not expire for the duration of your studies.
    - The course must be taken in Canada
    - The course must have a hands-on component
    - This is a relatively new offering and remains so it is recommended not to complete until after June 30<sup>th</sup> of the year you will be starting the program in September
  - Provide personal record of all Immunization and Booster Information.
    - If you do not have access to your immunization records, a report from your physician with titre results for each vaccine-preventable disease will be accepted.
  - Current TB test (within 6 months of the program start date)
- Generally, a package of forms are sent to the in-coming cohort in August and are required to be received by the program by Orientation Day in September
