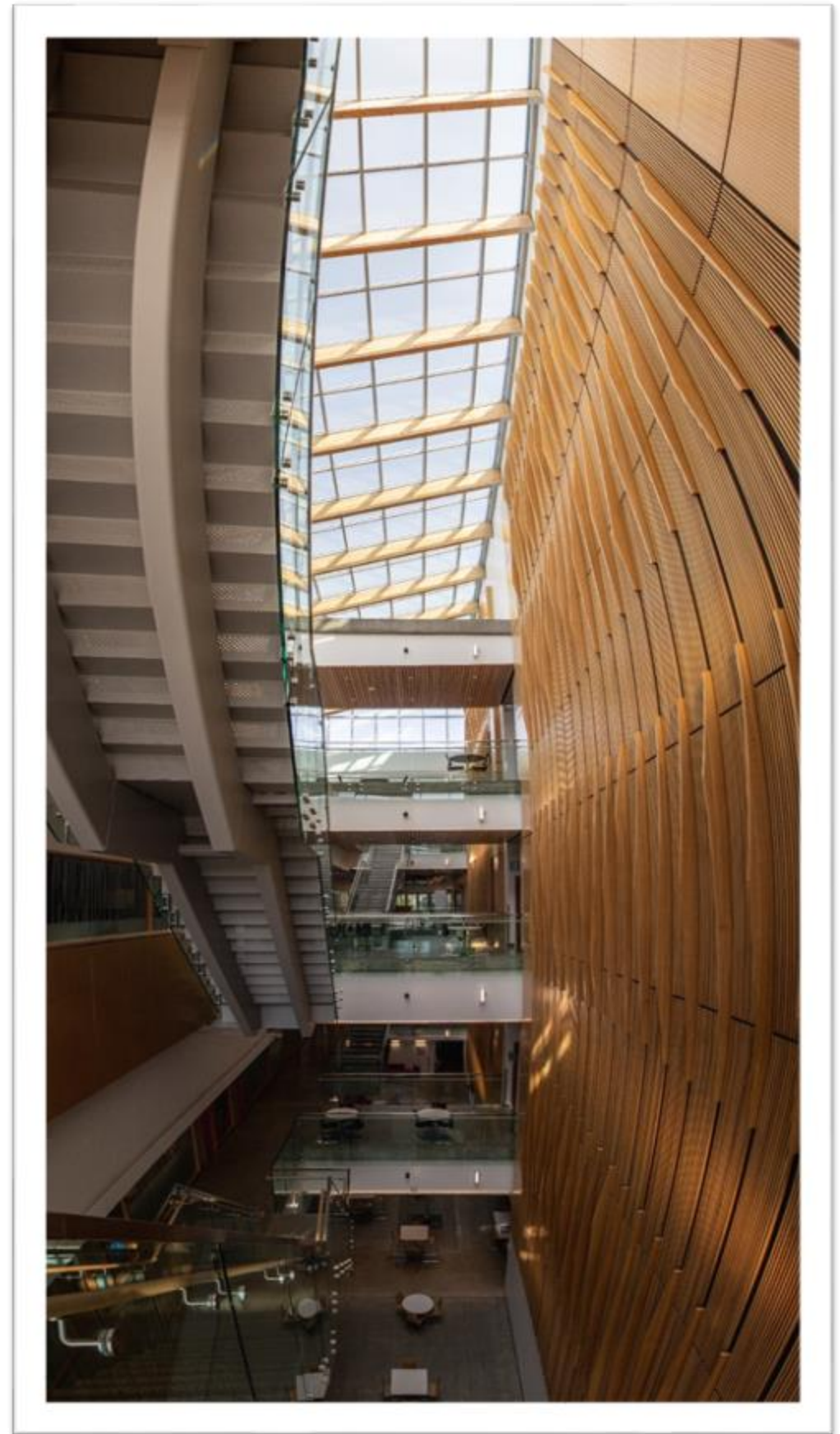


Territorial Acknowledgement

- Our goal is to educate and support “flourishing individuals, families, and communities”.

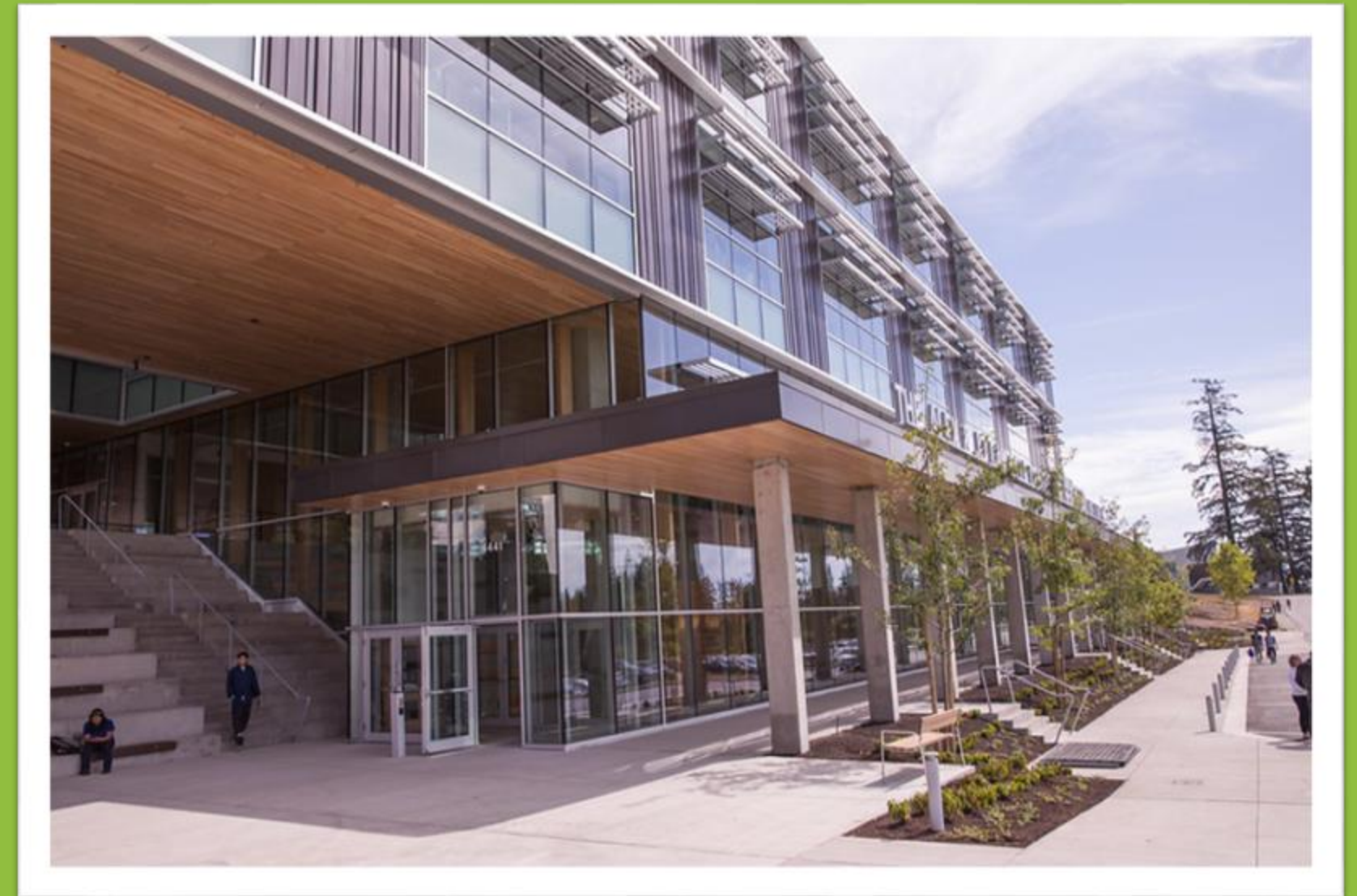
Centre for Health and Wellness (CHW)

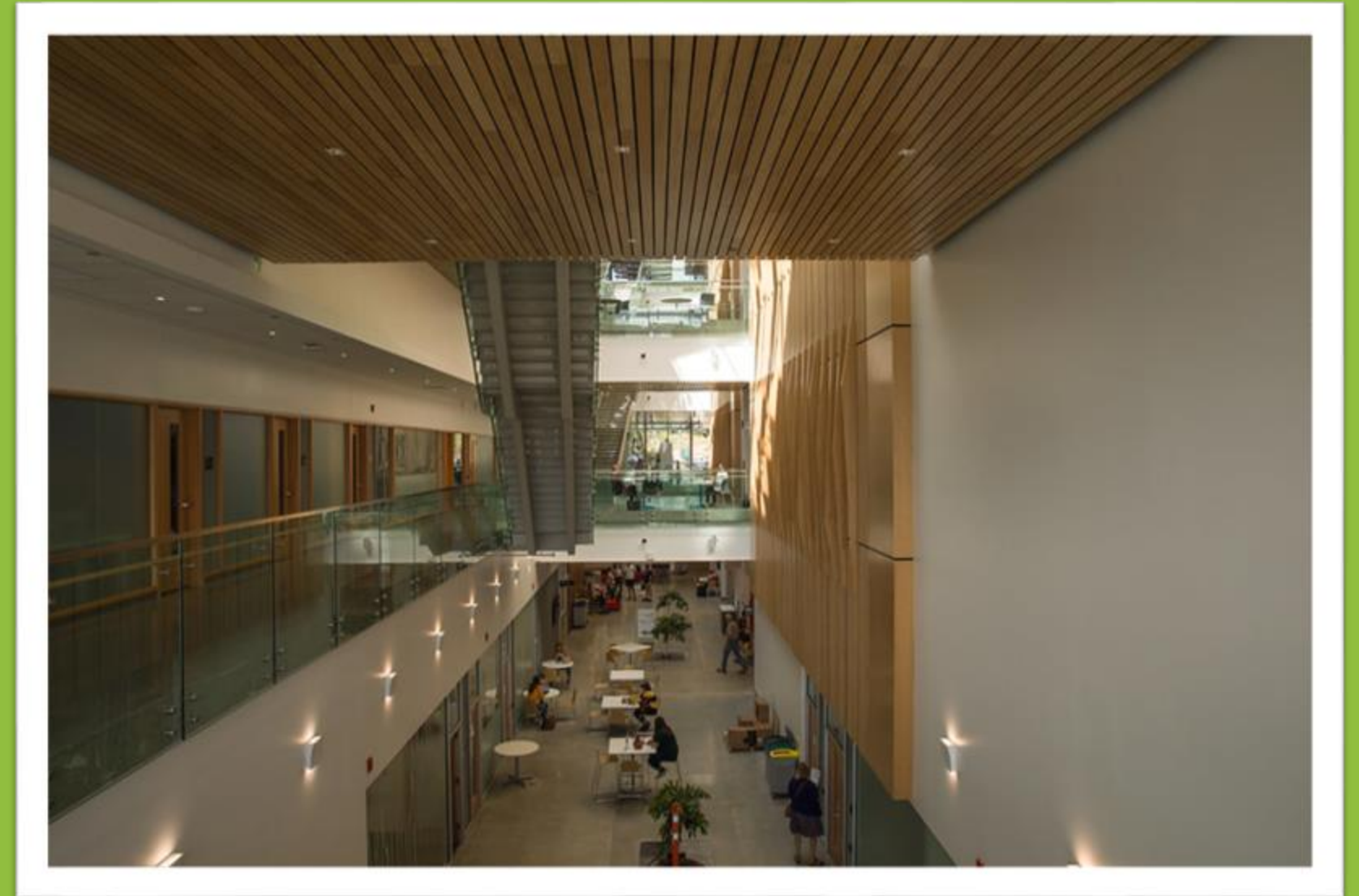
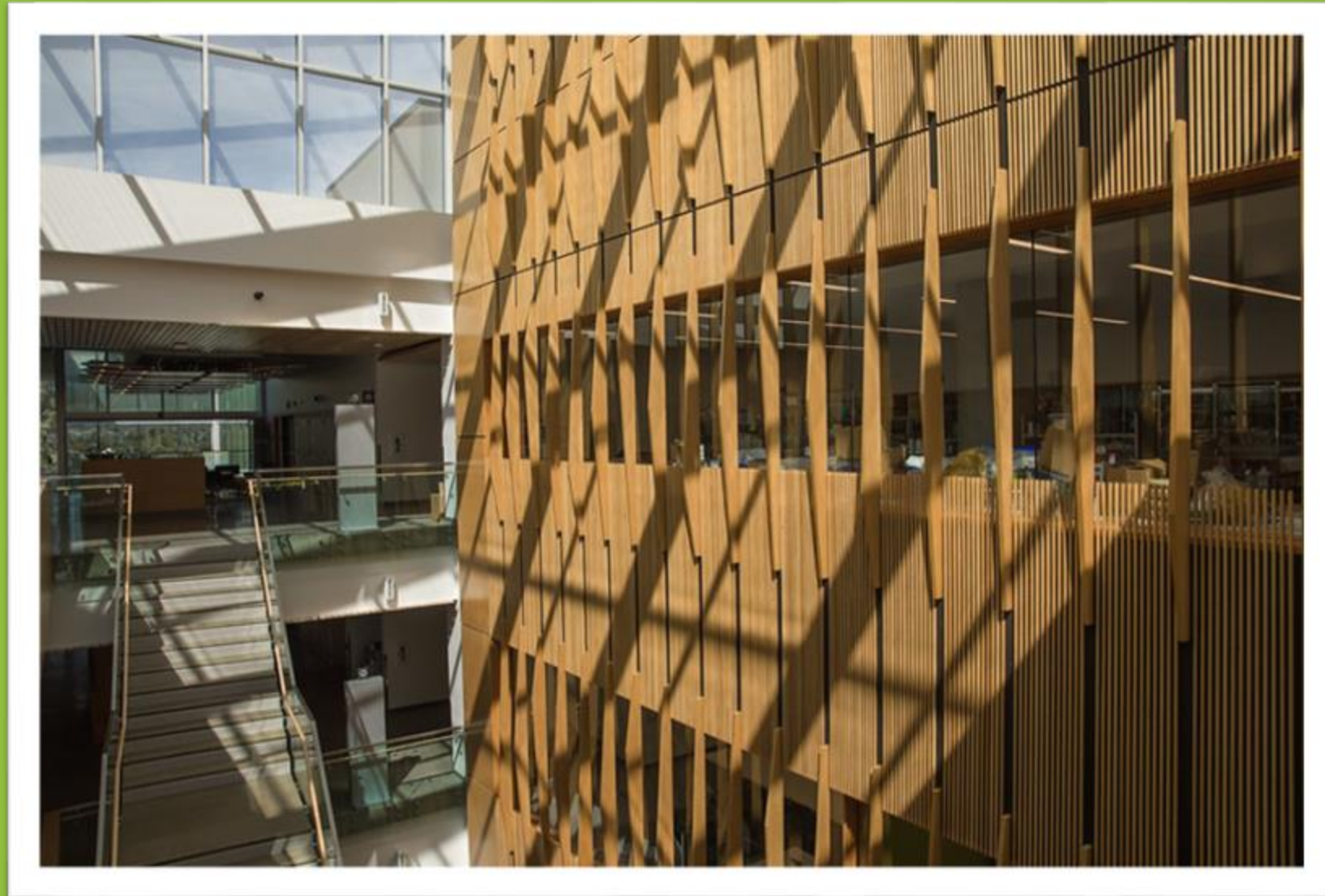

Employers expect sensitive and helpful responses to a wide range of problem situations, learning environments and behaviours.

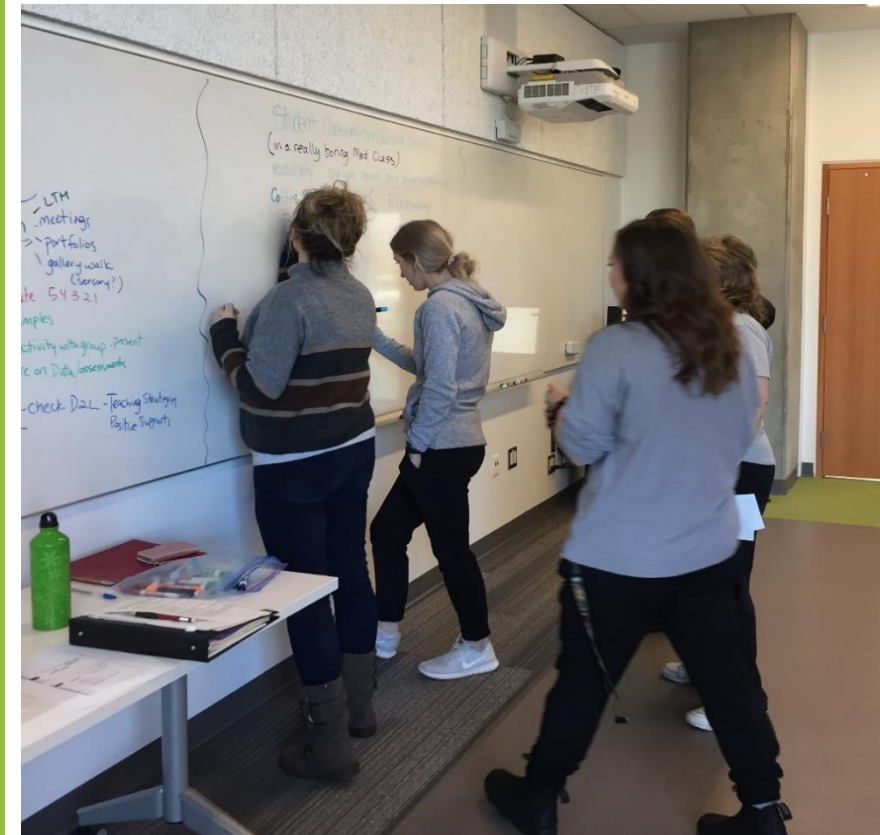
- The work may involve participation in school and community settings, recreation activities, wellness needs of individuals.
- Both classroom and field work require a professional way of being with behaviours and attitudes that require us to challenge personal beliefs and values.

EACS Student Expectations:

- To be open, willing to give and receive feedback, critically evaluate their own performance and make themselves available for individual, online, group and virtual schoolwork and working with classmates outside of class time for some projects.
- To deal with interpersonal communication, resolving conflict and negotiating, in a context of diverse opinions and learning styles, in mature and productive ways.

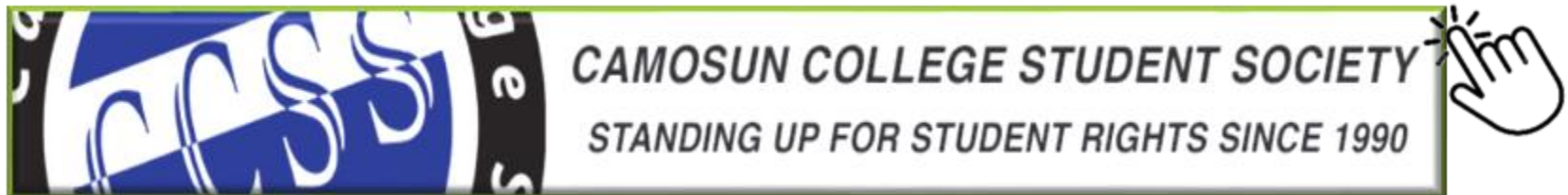
