- 1. Welcome
 - Sherri Bell, Committee Chair extended a warm welcome to all in attendance and expressed grateful acknowledgement of the Coast Salish Territory on which the meeting took place.
 - Ray Wolfe presented an overview of the part that Thinkspace has played thus far in the Camosun Film Studio Project
- 2. Draft Business Case Review
 - A high-level overview of the Business Case Report was presented; the purpose of which was to provide committee members with an opportunity to comment, make suggestions and ask questions pertaining to the document.
 - Topics addressed in the overview included:
 - Project context
 - Educational programming specialized courses to be developed in the subject areas of Production Assistant, gaffing, set design and construction, camera and lighting, hair and makeup, costume design, special effects. There will be strong emphasis on indigenous education

- **Functional programming focusing on education** digital editing facilities, green screen environments, classrooms, workshops for wardrobe, carpentry and props, equipment staging
- Functional programming focusing on Film Studio 3 sound stages, production offices, support buildings for wardrobe, set decoration storage, special effects & props, mill/paint shop, 'circus' parking, secure and private site
- Financial Analysis preliminary capital budget has been prepared. An operating budget for the studio will be developed by the studio operating proponent once identified
- **Stakeholders** twenty-one key sector industry stakeholder interviews have been conducted.
- Operations to be managed by a third-party company. Camosun will retain oversight of studio operations through membership in the studio governing body and will be responsible for education operations on site
 Risk Assessment
- A question was raised regarding amount of square footage reserved for use as office space in the current plan. Response: approximately 3,000 square feet

3. Next Steps

- The project business case will go before the Board of Governors at an 'In Camera' meeting scheduled to take place on December 6, 2021. A motion will be sought for the board to approve the project in principal.
- Next meeting of the Camosun Film Studio Advisory Committee will take place in mid to late February, 2022
- Camosun's focus early in 2022 will be to increase community engagement.
- Expression of interest conversations will also begin very early in 2022
- Much work will be done to explore ways of funding this project.
